Phillip Pental, Member of Parliament, journalist, historian and writer, was the founding president of the City of South Perth Historical Society and the author of five books, two of which record the social history of South Perth. "South Perth – The Vanishing Village", 2002; and "Hands that Heal: The story of a unique Australian: the Community owned South Perth Hospital", 2006.

Phillip's remarkable contribution to the heritage of South Perth includes the many photographs that he and his son Simon took, creating a lasting photographic record of buildings that no longer exist. The written word interwoven with the reality of a photograph is the inspiration for the Phillip Pental Young Heritage Award.

The Phillip Pendal Young Heritage Award winner and selected entries of 'Special Merit' will be displayed as part of this Exhibition.

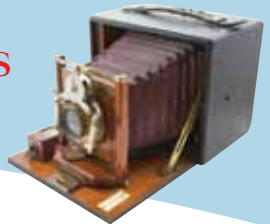

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY



- Entry is open to all students residing or attending school or college in the City of South Perth.
- Write an historical story of the City of South Perth using as inspiration, a photograph that portrays one of the themes below.

Themes:

- A family history from the City of South Perth
- Industry
- Entertainment
- Swan River
- Transport
- Your photograph, your history.

NB: Entrants are encouraged to use a photograph which they have taken or from their own collection. If this is not possible you may select one of two photographs which are available on our website: www.southperthhistoricalsociety.org

- Written component must be the entrant's own original work and reflect factual aspects of heritage and history relevant to the City of South Perth i.e. Como, Karawara, Kensington, Manning, Salter Point, South Perth or Waterford and boundary rivers. History does not mean only what happened in an early era, but also anything which occurred before today.
- Each entry should be between 100 to 800 words. Entrants shall state the sources and references used for the information contained in their entries.
- There is a limit of one entry per student.
- Photograph may be portrait or landscape, colour or black and white and presented in 30cm x 15cm, 50cm x 22cm or 45cm x 32cm
- Winning entries will be mounted and framed for exhibition.
- Photograph and written work with entry form attached will be accepted. On Thursday 19 May 2011 at the South Perth Civic Library between 3:00pm and 7:00pm. Digital entries will be accepted, photograph in 300dpi or more and the written component in MS Word 2000 or higher. Please forward, with completed Entry Form to: info@southperthhistoricalsociety.org
- Winning entries and selected entries of Special Merit will be displayed as part of the Heritage Exhibition. Copies of all entries will be retained and may be used in future promotion of this Award or future heritage displays or publications by the City of South Perth Historical Society. The entrant's name will be acknowledged in all publications of the submitted work.
- Judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
- All reasonable care will be taken to protect entries, but claims for loss or damage to entered work will not be accepted.
